**From the President
Ed Child**

As was reported in the March newsletter, we had a leak in our borough water tower that needed repair. All is well now, but I wanted to use this space to update our residents on our borough water system. We are fortunate to have our own water system as we have direct control over the rates. Unlike other municipalities which have sold their water systems to larger companies, such as Bucks County Water and Sewer or North Penn Water, We prefer to keep our system local.

Our system relies on two wells to supply our water. We have had water pressure problems in the last year because we had some leaks, large and small, compounded by the fact that we were running only one well. Even though this is a small local system, we have to conform to all of the regulations that come down from the federal EPA and the state DEP. The leaks that we are aware of have been repaired but the requirements to reduce arsenic levels in our water caused us some major delays in compliance. Both wells are up and running and meeting the arsenic removal levels.

If a catastrophic breakdown in our system should occur, we do have emergency interconnections to both the Milford Township and Richland Township Water Systems. Milford Township has been a very good neighbor in times of low water pressure and when our water tower was leaking.

Water Costs Money –don't waste it!





See the table below for how much water can be lost even with a hole no bigger than 1/16". Wow, 74,000 gallons in only 3 months! Please make sure all of your pipes are in good shape. Some ways to conserve water and save yourself some money are:

- Take shorter showers.
- Only do full loads of wash.
- Run the dishwasher only when it is fully loaded.
- Only water plants when they need it.
- Do not water your lawn.

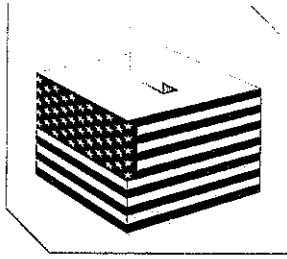

A continuous leak from a hole this size would, over a three month period, waste water in the amounts shown above.



Election 2015

Voter turnout for this year's General Election on November 3 is expected to be light, as it was for the Primary Election, but there are some important decisions to be made. To be elected state wide are Commonwealth Court Judge (1), Superior Court Judge (1) and Supreme Court Justice (3). In Bucks County the three Commissioners are up for re-election. Also to be elected in the county are four Row Offices – Treasurer, Register of Wills, Coroner and Clerk of Courts. In Trumbauersville three council seats are up for reelection. Although the borough candidates are unopposed, please show them that their community supports them by coming out to vote for them.

The last day to register to vote in this year's general election is October 2. Voter registration forms and absentee applications are available in the borough office.

Trumbauersville Councilman on State Association Leadership Team

Council President Ed Child was sworn in as the Immediate Past President of The Pennsylvania State Association of Boroughs at its annual conference in Lancaster. He is now in his final year of four years as an officer in the state association, having served as President last year. As an officer he is a member of the association's Leadership Team and will chair the Legal Assistance Committee, the Nominating Committee and the Constitution & Bylaws Committee and will also serve as Vice Chair of the Resolutions & Policy Committee, the committee that works directly with our State Legislature. His term as Immediate Past President will run through June 30, 2016. The association serves the 957 boroughs in our state, with a population of 2.6 million residents.

FIRE MARSHAL/CEO NEWS

With the summer ending and the fall weather setting in within the next few weeks, please note the following sections of the Borough Burning Ordinance:

1. Recreational fires using natural wood of not more than four (4) cubic feet are permitted. Recreational fires with more than four (4) cubic feet require a permit.\
2. Burning of leaves, brush, yard waste, etc. is not permitted as per Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) regulations.
3. Outdoor fires shall be confined in a non-combustible container covered with a wire screen of one-half inch or smaller mesh.
4. Outdoor fires shall be permitted only on private property and shall take place at least twenty (20) feet from any building, property line or road line.
5. All fires shall be attended by an individual 18 years or older.
6. Non-recreational fires will not be allowed to burn or smolder between sunset and sunrise.

To obtain a burning permit call the Borough Fire Marshal, Craig Wilhelm at 215-802-4572.

As a reminder, ALL rental properties must be inspected annually. If you have a rental property and it has not been registered please stop by the Borough office to complete the paperwork and schedule an inspection.

If you have any questions concerning rental property inspections, contact the Borough office or the Borough Fire Marshal/Code Enforcement Officer.

YARD SALE SIGNS

If you are having a yard sale/garage sale/junk sale, please be advised that the borough's sign ordinance does not allow signs to be posted on any utility poles or sign posts. Any sign found on a utility pole or sign post will be removed and the sign owner fined. Similarly, any sign not removed from public property/road right-of-ways after the date of your sale will be subject to the same fate.

COMPLAINTS

The borough occasionally receives anonymous complaints, either by phone message or letter. The borough does not respond to or take any action based on anonymous complaints. If you call with a complaint, give us your name and where you live. If you write a letter, include your name and address. We need to be sure you are actually a borough resident before we take any action. Or, better yet, come to a monthly public meeting to discuss your particular situation with us.
