If you or anyone in your household is experiencing any symptoms from the COVID-19 virus, you are required to **call the Board of Health (215-345-3318) first before 911** so they can ask the proper questions to better protect the responders coming to your emergency.

The Trumbauersville Borough office is closed to the public. Contact the office by email or phone. Please drop any information, bills or correspondence in the mail slot to the right of the front door.

Please continue to support Spor's, Trum Tavern and Fino's as they all will do delivery within the borough and curbside pick-up. Spor's will also provide grocery items as well as menu food items. When you place your order you will need to pay with your credit card so no money will be exchanged and contact will be limited.

This is a great time to do all of the things that you never had a chance to do. All of the small projects, book and magazines to read, cleaning out of closets, etc. The Trumbauersville Fire Company has a donation shed behind the fire house for used clothing and items. The items they will accept are listed on the shed. There are also tax donation slips for you to take when making your generous donation. Liberty Thrift shop in Quakertown and Care and Share in Souderton will take other items also as a tax deduction for you. Please support these organizations while cleaning and downsizing your unwanted items.
