#### REPORTS

The Planning Commission met on September 15. There were only two agenda items.

- 1. Crystal Hessler, borough Water Engineer. Discuss the Boro's Source Water Protection Study.
- 2. Completion of the proposed Light Industrial Zoning District ordinance.

Crystal discussed source water protection and the definition of a protection zone. At the July PC meeting, a member of the attending residents had erroneously referred to it as an exclusion zone. PC Chair Child explained that the houses on Creamery Road, Bracalente Manufacturing, Earls Pub, and Grill, as well as several houses on North Main Street, were all in the protection zone.

PC Chair Child read through the proposed LI ordinance line-by-line to ensure everyone understood what was in it. The residents' main topic of discussion was their concern regarding stormwater runoff and possible flooding.

After the discussion, the planning commission members agreed that the proposed LI district ordinance was ready for review by the Bucks County Planning Commission and the Borough Engineer.

After the meeting, a question arose about the proposed farmette on the former Rosenberger lot, now owned by Bracalente. If the farmette were subdivided after the LI district was approved, it would be considered in the LI district. So, the draft ordinance's submission was postponed until that could be sorted out.

Questions regarding technical aspects of the ongoing work on the public water system will only be answered by the licensed water operator and the water department engineers. All questions should be submitted to the Borough Administrator, who will forward to the appropriate licensed party. All questions and responses will be presented at the next Borough Council meeting.

### 1. Trum-Milford Township Water Interconnection (CAI 00907.29)

- a. A preconstruction meeting was held on August 21. The Contractor anticipates performing tree removal mid-September. Vault installation is anticipated for the beginning of November.
- b. Application has been submitted to PennDOT for installation of a construction access from Trumbauersville Road. The permit is currently under review by PennDOT.

#### 2. Well #2 (CAI 00907.17)

- a. Installation of the Well #2 replacement pump is scheduled to proceed after completion of the Interconnection improvements.
- b. Well #2 continues to operate in accordance with DEP approvals. Routine media change was completed by August 26, 2024.

#### 3. Well #3 Upgrades (CAI 00907.29)

- a. Permit number 0924511 for construction of the Well #3 Upgrades was issued by DEP on June 3, 2024. Per the COA, construction of the improvements to be completed within 180 days of permit issuance.
- b. Public bids for this project were received via PennBID on August 6, 2024. Council approved the Notice of Intent to Award on September 5, 2024.
- c. Borough's PennVest loan application for project funding is under review by PennVest. A Notice to Proceed cannot be issued until the project is fully funded.

## 4. Consent Order and Agreement (COA) (CAI 00907.29)

- a. The Borough has met compliance dates in the COA. The submittal of bi-weekly updates to DEP is required until interconnection is in operation.
- b. The COA requires completion of the Well #3 treatment upgrades by November 30, 2024. CAI will work with Borough to request a time extension as needed when funding is approved and a construction schedule is provided.

## 5. Faber Distillery Water Usage Insp. (CAI 00907.30)

a. CAI understands Dani McClanahan is coordinating with the facility's new owner and Milford Township Area Sewer Authority manager Harry Koenig regarding scheduling a site inspection and new Borough water meter installation.

## 6. Service Line Inventory (SLI) PWSID 190091 (CAI 00907.31)

- a. The initial service line inventory is due to DEP on October 16, 2024. CAI is finalizing the DEP required inventory spreadsheet for submission. Water system operator, Ken Fulford Associates, will perform the electronic upload of the inventory via the DEP Drinking Water Electronic Lab Reporting (DWELR) system.
- Borough Staff have assisted CAI in compiling sufficient data to verify 95% of the system side service lines are constructed of copper. The material of the remaining service lines has not been verified at this time.
- c. Customer responses, inspections by the Borough plumber, and record reviews have provided sufficient evidence to verify 38% of the customer side of service lines as "Non-Lead". <u>No lead service</u> <u>lines were identified in the Borough.</u> Additional verification efforts will be required to obtain sufficient evidence to satisfy DEP requirements.
- d. Service lines which have not been adequately verified will be identified as "Lead Status Unknown" when the Service Line Inventory is submitted October 16. The Borough will be required to update the Service Line Inventory annually until all service lines have been verified as "Non-Lead".
- e. Following submission of the Initial Service Line Inventory, water systems are required to notify all customers (by November 15<sup>th</sup>) whose service lines were reported as "Lead Status Unknown" in the initial inventory. CAI will continue to work with Dani McClahan to prepare a notice letter per DEP and EPA requirements.

#### 7. Future Projects

- a. Upon completion of interconnection for emergency water supply, Borough will schedule hydrant flushing, leak detection and exercising of water line valves.
- b. CAI will assist the Borough with development a capital improvements plan for 2026. This anticipated to include preparation of specifications for inspection of the buried chlorine contact tank at Well #2Treatment building.
