

Trumbauersville Borough Council
August 6, 2026, Council Meeting Minutes
7:00 PM

Council Members Present: Chris Betz, Ed Child, Ally Goodin, Mike George, and Robert Hyde. Dani McClanahan, Jim Black, and Solicitor Colby Grim were present. Stephen and Becky Spor were absent.

Public Comment on Agenda Items:

Resident DS remarked on the TFC refusal to give a favorable response regarding the installation of traffic calming measures on E. Broad (speed slots)

JB suggested staggering parking as a visual aid to slow traffic.

Minutes: Motion by Councilman Hyde, seconded by Councilwoman Goodin, to accept the July 2, 2026, minutes as they were presented. Vote: All in favor, motion carried.

Check Register: Motion by VP Child, seconded by Councilman Hyde to approve the check register. Vote: All in favor, motion carried.

QAPC: No report

Borough Managers Report:

- Speed Slot installation on E Broad St.
 - o Met with representatives from Levy Bus Co who are opposed, stating the speed slots would increase stress on bus suspensions and increase maintenance issues.
 - o Trumbauersville Elementary is in favor of installation
 - o Trumbauersville Fire Company reported a unanimous no when they voted on the topic at their last meeting.
- Resolution 2026-07
 - o A motion by Councilwoman Goodin, seconded by Councilman Hyde to establish a memorial service to be held for veterans annually on the Sunday before Memorial Day, 2 PM. Vote: all in favor, motion carries.
- Local Share Account (LSA) awards are expected early fall
- Flood Plain remediation grants are expected to be announced early 2027.
- Applications are now being accepted for 2027 LSA grants. On a motion by VP Child, seconded by Councilwoman Goodin, the borough will apply for two LSA grants for the following projects:
 - o Address the flooding on N. Main Street, north of Oak Drive
 - o Road repair and restoration on Woodview and associated side streets in the development.
- The lawn maintenance contract expires 12/31/2026. Due to rising fuel prices, the current contractor will not be able to take the two-year extension. Motion by Councilman Hyde, seconded by Councilman George, authorizing putting the lawn maintenance contract out to public bid. Vote: all in favor, motion carries.
- Office copier is at lease end, and I would like to replace the stand-alone machine with a desktop model with the same paper capacity and abilities as the current unit, but without the staple feature. The smaller machine will decrease the monthly payments from \$245.00 to \$160.00. Two companies provided estimates for similar units and abilities, both coming in at \$160.00 per month. A motion was made by VP Child, seconded by Councilwoman Goodin, to lease the new machine and stay the current company, UBEO. Vote: All in favor, motion carries.

- ZHB convened a hearing on July 22nd for property at 118 N Main St. requesting variances to convert the building from commercial use to residential. Variances were approved with conditions.

- Motion by Councilwoman Goodin, seconded by VP Child, authorizing FP services for traffic control duties for the Halloween parade scheduled for October 25th. Vote: all in favor, motion carried.
